The Eighth and Tenth Commandments

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

X. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

VIII: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- Negatively: Prohibits all violations of truth
- Positively: Enjoins sharing the truth with all

Some Sins Against the Eighth Commandment

(See USCC 432)

- <u>Skepticism</u>: The denial of objective truth or our access to it.
- Lying: Making an untrue statement with the intent to deceive
- <u>Rash judgment</u>: Forming a negative opinion of someone without sufficient evidence.
- <u>Detraction</u>: The unjust telling of someone's true faults.
- Calumny: Telling lies meant to make another look bad.
- Perjury: Lying under oath.
- Hypocrisy: Saying one thing while doing the opposite.

Testimony of the Saints: Better to Die than to Lie

- Many martyrs have chosen death rather than violation of truth:
 - Early martyrs who refused to deny the faith
 - Thomas More and John Fisher
 - The French Carmelites
 - Other favorite examples?

When to Withhold the Truth (or to Refrain from Seeking it)

- Apply the Golden Rule:
 - Would I want others to tell this (or know this) about me?
- How might this apply to the use of social media?

X: You shall not covet your neighbor's goods

- Negatively: Prohibits greed and envy
- Positively: Enjoins generosity and detachment from riches (poverty of spirit)

Some Sins Against the Tenth Commandment (See USCC 450)

- Greed: An inordinate desire for temporal goods
- Envy: Sadness at the sight of another's prosperity



Some Ways to Keep the Tenth Commandment

- Humility
- Thanksgiving
 - Grace before and/or after meals
- Goodwill
- Surrender to providence (Matthew 6:24-34)
- Giving (especially during Lent)
 - Material goods
 - Time and talent (stewardship of vocation)
- Finding satisfaction in God
 - "You are all I want. You are all I need."

A Contemporary Application: Stewardship of Creation

- Based on Genesis 1:28
- One way to reduce consumption of resources is to learn to be content with less (especially during Lent).
 - Consider buying fewer new products
 - Try not to prepare more food than you can reasonably eat
 - See Laudato Si for more suggestions
